## South Campground Regulations

Reservations can be made at [www.recreation.gov](http://www.recreation.gov), or by calling 1-877-444-6777.

### Camping Etiquette

- *Check out time is 11:00am Mountain Time.*
- Check in is any time after 12pm Mountain Time on the scheduled date of arrival.
- Quiet hours are 10pm–8am
- Generator use is limited to the hours of 8am–10am and 6pm–8pm
- Do not move picnic tables.
- Camping equipment and vehicles must remain within assigned site boundaries and parking pad and cannot be on vegetation.

### Campground Use Limits

- *Maximum of 6 occupants per site, including children over 24 months.*
- Maximum of 2 vehicles, or 1 RV or camping trailer, or 4 motorcycles per site.

### Vehicle Parking

- *ALL vehicles and trailers must be kept on designated parking pads and not on vegetation or within the tent site.*
- Overflow parking may be available at the Nature Center near the entrance to the campground.

### Food Storage and Sanitation

- *Feeding wildlife is strictly prohibited.*
- Food and garbage must be stored properly at all times. Food should be stored inside a vehicle or a lockable hard sided container. Garbage should be secured in the same way or be disposed of in the receptacles provided in the campground. Food is defined as food, drinks, toiletries, cosmetics, pet food and bowls, or any other scented items. Coolers, dirty stoves, grills, non-disposable tableware and cookware must be washed or stored in the same manner as food.
- Black water must be disposed of at the dump station provided in the campground. It should never be released onto the ground, into the river, or in irrigation ditches.
- Bathing and washing of clothing or dishes at public faucets or in restrooms are prohibited. These activities should be performed at your campsite. Food particles should be strained from dishwater before disposing of in drains. Gray water produced by activities such as showering, bathing, cleaning, rinsing, etc. of any person or object with soap or other cleaning products must be collected and disposed of either at the campground dump station or in drains located near water spigots outside each restroom.
- Showers and laundry are available in the town of Springdale for a fee.

### Fires and Firewood

- *Wood gathering is prohibited in the park. Wood is available for purchase in Springdale.*
- Fires are permitted in the furnished grates at each site. Fires should never be left unattended until completely extinguished with plenty of water and cool to the touch.
- Campers are responsible for understanding current fire restrictions. Please check with a ranger or camp host if you need additional information.
- Fireworks are prohibited in Zion.

### Pets

- Properly restrained pets are allowed in developed campgrounds, picnic areas, on the grounds of the Zion Lodge, and along public roads and parking areas within 100 feet of the road surface. Pets are allowed on the Pa'rus trail but may not be taken on any other trails in Zion National Park. Service animals are not subject to the park's pet policies and are allowed everywhere that visitors are allowed when accompanying an individual with a disability.
- Pets may be left unattended in developed campgrounds when tied to an object or secured in an enclosure provided environmental conditions (e.g., temperature) do not pose a risk to the animal's wellbeing and the pet is not making unreasonable noise. If NPS personnel determine that an animal is in imminent danger or causing a disturbance action may be taken to prevent harm to the animal and park resources.
- Pet excrement must be picked up and properly disposed of by the owner in all areas within Zion National Park.

### Recreation Equipment

- Hammocks are only permitted within the established footprint of a campsite to prevent resource damage. Trees with a minimum diameter of 10 inches should be used and adequate padding must be between the straps and bark to prevent injury to the tree.
- Bicycles are only allowed on the paved Pa'rus Trail and park roads.
- In-line skates and non-motorized scooters are allowed only on the campground roads and the Pa'rus Trail.
- River tubing and skateboarding are prohibited within the park.
- Attaching or suspending items from trees which may cause tree or limb damage is prohibited, as is attaching any item to trees or vegetation with nails, wire or chains.
- Installation of sports equipment such as horseshoe pits and stakes, volleyball nets, etc. is prohibited.
- Use of firearms is prohibited.
- Use of OHVs and ATVs is prohibited.
